Eco Children is a non-profit organisation, initiated by the Klaserie Private Nature Reserve – the organisation focuses on hands-on environmental education and school development as a whole. The organisation operates in Limpopo and Mpumalanga provinces in north east South Africa, areas with some of the country's most severe social and environmental issues.
